



October is one of my favorite times of year. The leaves are changing, the air has a crispness, schedules are a little more set and routine.

October also has one of my favorite Sundays: World Communion Sunday (I know, a pastor shouldn't have a favorite Sunday, but what can I say?!). I love that it is the day in the whole of Christendom that we know we are breaking bread and sharing the cup with our siblings in faith, not only across the world, but across traditions and borders of *all* kinds.

This year, HUPC will be observing World Communion Sunday, October 2, marks a significant portion of a *Season of Peace*. This is the Sunday we will be collecting for the PC(USA) denominational offering *Peace & Global Witness*, but we will also begin looking at ways in which we are called to be *peace-makers*.

Oftentimes, when we think about peace, we simply imagine a time and space absent of conflict. We picture *peace-keepers*, armed men and women who hold off violence through the *threat* of violence. *This is not peace*.

Peace-making is what we are called to. The biblical concept of shalom proclaims that peace involves wholeness and right relationships in all of life. Peace-makers seek to offer peace wherever we encounter brokenness: in individual lives, families, congregations, communities, between nations, and with creation.*

This is an important aspect of our call to be a Matthew 25 congregation, and one that I am excited to explore with you over the coming weeks and months.

Let us not just *speak* peace... let us *be* peace.



Adult Study Opportunity

Race & Reconciliation

(from the "Being Reformed" study series)

Saturday, October 1st (as part of the Potluck for Peace, 5-7:30 pm)

Sunday Mornings, October 2, 9, 16, 30, and November 6 *following worship*

Reformed Christians confess what we believe. Throughout the world, Reformed churches have produced confessions of faith to witness to their Christian faith in different circumstances, cultures, and localities. We take seriously what the psalmist proclaimed: "Let the redeemed of the Lord say so" (Psalm 107:2).

This study focuses on two confessions of faith from the twentieth century. The Confession of 1967 was adopted by the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. and is now part of the *Book of Confessions* of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The Confession of Belhar was composed in South Africa (1982) and adopted by the Dutch Reformed Mission Church in 1986. Both confessions are theologically grounded and address issues that continue to be crucial for the church in the twenty-first century.


This study enables us to hear the call of these confessions to the church and to us as Christian people. As one voice, we say what we believe; and, by God's grace, we try to live it.

The first session will be woven into our gathering at the Potluck for Peace, and will be continued over five additional sessions following worship through Sunday, November 6 (except for October 23, when Pastor Kyle will be away).

If you are interested in participating, there is no cost, we just ask that you please sign up by speaking to Pastor Kyle or calling Kim in the church office *by Wednesday, September 28*.

This study lives into our call as a Matthew 25 congregation, and is an important part of our Season of Peace.


**Personal Care Items Needed by UAlbany’s Purple Pantry





- Leaves
- White paper
- White crayon (label removed)
- Watercolor paints
- Water
- Paintbrush



What you do:

1. Gather leaves of different shapes and sizes. On a table, arrange them flat without overlaps. Set the paper over them.
2. Hold the crayon sideways and use the long edge to color over the leaves. You'll make an invisible rubbing of them.
3. Then paint over the paper with watercolors. The areas with crayon will resist the paint and reveal the hidden leaf designs.
