

Siblings in Christ,

I am finding it difficult to believe that we are already nearing the beginning of November, and that in a few short weeks, we will be gearing up for the Christmas season. This time of year is my favorite; November is one of my favorite months, if not my favorite. The winds have grown colder; our neighbor's wood burning stove greets me with the sweet smell of a fire every morning when I leave, and every evening when I return. It is time for hot mulled cider, thick flannel shirts and wool socks, and anticipation of the holiday season, though that craziness won't arrive for a few weeks. But this is also the beginning of a season of family, shared purpose, and community, which I love and appreciate most.

As we enter November, we also come to the end of the church calendar year. On Sunday, November 27, we will celebrate the first Sunday of Advent, which is actually the beginning of a new year in our liturgical tradition (interesting note: this year is about as early as Advent ever begins, but while the season might feel a little longer, don't procrastinate on your Christmas shopping!). Not only are we entering a season of hope and joy, but of new beginnings made possible through Jesus Christ.

As we look toward a new church year, I want to encourage all of us to look at how we make the church a part of our lives. Is it something we “do” once a week? Or is it a lifestyle and a worldview that we actively participate in? Is it something we claim in word only? Or is it a way we live in the world?

We know who Jesus calls us to be, and that is sometimes really hard, especially when other demands are placed on our already stretched-too-thin time. With that in mind, I'd like to refer you to an old children's sermon I remember hearing when I was young:

Laid out on a table, next to a quart-size mason jar, was a rock, some large stones, some small pebbles, and some sand. The minister went ahead to tell us that the rock was God, the large stones our family and friends, the pebbles small, but important things like school and sports, and the sand was everything extra in our lives. He went ahead to put the sand in the jar first, then the pebbles, then the stones, and what we noticed was that there was no room left in the jar for the rock.

However, when we emptied it all out to start over, if we put the big rock in first, then the larger stones, then the pebbles, and ending with the sand, everything, remarkably, fit.

See, if we start with God, putting God first and foremost, everything else falls into place. Everything else just fits! It sometimes takes a concerted effort, especially at first, but once we get in the habit, things get easier, and our lives are much richer and fuller because of it.

Now, I'm not one for New Year's Resolutions, but that's something I could get on board with trying. Will you join me?



## Session Highlights - October, 2022

We are bringing back the “Session Highlights” newsletter item in order to keep the congregation better informed of the important business Session is taking and pursuing on everyone’s behalf. If anyone has questions or comments on anything reported here, please feel free to speak with any Session member, Pastor Kyle, or Clerk of Session, Bruce Williamson.

At their October 9 meeting, Pastor Kyle reported the Guilderland "Interfaith Council" recently met to discuss “rebranding” the group to be more inclusive and to start planning the return of the December Community Advent Service. This service of songs and readings is scheduled for December 4, again at Christ the King Catholic Church. Stay tuned for more details.

Session discussed the upcoming “Harvest Celebration” being planned, to be held after worship on October 30. This community event will feature hot dogs, a fire pit and toasted marshmallows, and a chili cook-off. The community will be invited and more information will be forthcoming.

Pastor Kyle noted he is working on reinvigorating HUPC’s “Faith Formation” Team, formerly called “Christian Education”. He is looking for anyone interested this initiative, aimed at all ages, to join in the discussions and planning. If you have an interest, please let Pastor Kyle know directly.

On the Property front, Session is happy to report the mold remediation work in the Sanctuary basement are has been completed. This was a major project and expense, paid for through the recent gift from the Hallenbeck family.

The next Property priority for using remaining Hallenbeck funds is the replacement of the (cracked) sanctuary entrance steps, the (non-compliant) accessible ramp and the (sticking) sanctuary outer door. Session is seeking an architect, designer and/or contractor to plan out the necessary work so it can be bid out to contractors. (This is proving to be a challenge. If anyone has any suggestions of firms that could assist us, please let Pastor Kyle know.). We anticipate this will be an expensive project and may exceed the remaining Hallenbeck funds.

A third priority discussed is the replacement of the roadside sign. The Town of Guilderland recently revised their sign regulations and prohibited any new “electronic signs”. This means our only option is to replace the existing, movable-letters sign with a similar type of sign. A couple of sample designs and cost estimates have been provided to Session and the estimates run between \$12,000 - \$14,000 for a similar sign. This project is currently on hold, dependent on available funding after the front entry project is completed.

Session also moved to have the non-functioning water fountain in the education building hallway removed, with the feed and drain lines capped. The plan is to replace it with a Deacons’ information table.

Regarding Property, Session is currently without a Property Team leader, which poses challenges given the number of property-related issues we face with an aging infrastructure. Several people have stepped up to take lead on certain major projects or handle minor issues, but we really need someone who can serve as Team Leader. Session is asking everyone to consider helping out with this critical function and notes there are folks in place willing to assist, so it’s not a “one-person job”.




