

Beloved,

The season of winter may be winding down on the calendar, but winter weather is far from over for us. As I write this, we are anticipating another round of significant snowfall. Having grown up in the Rochester area, I know full well how arctic air can whip up a storm.

As a kid living along the shores of Lake Ontario, my friends and I rarely were treated a snow day off from school. The snowplow drivers in that part of New York State are just too good, and rarely did the snow ever get too far ahead of them. In my entire high school career, I can think of maybe two or three days we had off because of weather.

One of those days sticks in my head very clearly. My younger brother and I were so impressed with the amount of snow that had fallen, that we decided a little sledding activity was needed... from the top of the garage, which was higher than the second story windows in the house (and no, our mother was not aware of our plans!). The rush of falling and the momentary feeling of weightlessness was very unsettling: when will I land? How fast am I going? Where is my brother? When am I going to land?!

I imagine this feeling may be familiar. While we are steady and faithful, we are also experiencing a budget deficit, a sadness in the loss of some beloved members, and uncertainty of what the future of Hamilton Union looks like. The future, at times, feels uncertain.

Yet my heart is warm with thoughts of how Christ continues to work in and through our congregation. Just a month ago we had our annual meeting, and while we face significant challenges, I continue to trust that God is working a new thing in our midst. We are called to the continuous, steady walk of faith as God's people.

We are now in the season of Lent, journeying toward the cross, not at breakneck speeds from the roof of the garage, but slowly, with a patient Christ walking with us, knowing, loving, and faithful. In the coming days and weeks, I pray that we would, each of us, take time to reflect, pray, and challenge each other in our understanding of God's Word and Christ's call to us. Again: we have many challenges facing us. But this is a community of faith that has never shied away from such tests, and I know that the Spirit is moving in this place, hand in hand with us - a story worth singing! Oh, and I promise: I won't try sledding off the roof anytime soon!

NEW GUIDELINES FOR HUPC DEACONS TO HONOR PARISHIONERS WHO TURN 90 OR ABOVE:

When a church parishioner is to have a birthday, turning 90 or older, the Deacons shall honor the individual following the worship service on a Sunday on or near the birthday (with their permission). The Deacons will supply a birthday cake, etc. to be shared during the Fellowship Hour. Deacons should ask the honoree if transportation is needed and whether family and friends will attend. One birthday is to be celebrated per nonagenarian, but if the individual reaches 100, they MAY be honored again in the same manner. On February 26th, Dorothy Favitta celebrated her 95th birthday! Pictured here with her son, Lee and daughter in law, Pat.




Ukrainian Easter Traditions


