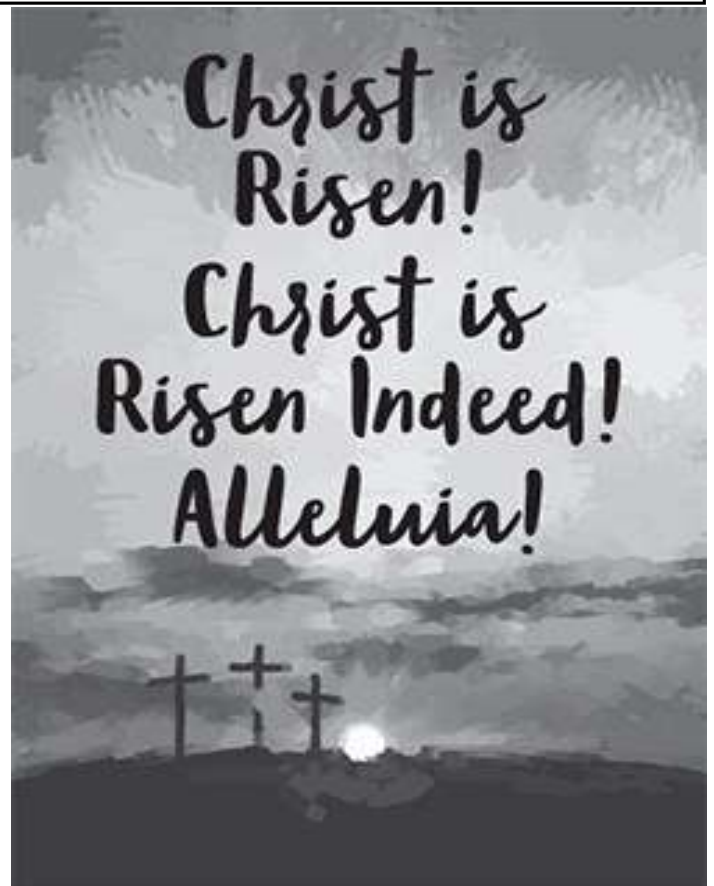

Beloved,

We are fully in the season of Lent, and as is typical, it is a very busy season! The life of a congregation always seems to pick up steam at this time of year with the addition of special worship services, special dinners, Lenten spiritual practices, and so on. Of course, spring is also right around the corner (though as I write this, we are anticipating *another* humdinger of a winter storm, and spring feels as far away as the moon!).

But spring *is* right around the corner - a time of new life and increased energy, as we prepare to throw off the shroud of blankets and winter jackets we have been bundled under all winter. It is no accident that our celebration of Easter happens in the spring, when we celebrate new life from what was once dead.

And everything we do centers around one place: the table. It is where our lives of faith - both individual and communal - revolve. When we engage in table fellowship, we are living into God’s hopes and desires for us: that we would live in communion and community, in relationship with one another. Sometimes those relationships are easy and natural; other times they are difficult to begin and nurture. God urges us to persist in *all* of those relationships, because in them we find the manifestation of the kingdom.

But here’s the thing: the table doesn’t have to necessarily be the communion table in worship (though that is a very important one for our worshiping life!). It can be a kitchen table, a table at the Capital City Diner, a picnic table... even a blanket spread out in the park. Whenever we meet to break bread and enjoy one another’s company, the Spirit is there, and communion is had.

See, something happens when we share a meal. We let our guard down and, at least for a short time, we allow ourselves to be vulnerable with one another. Sometimes we resist; sometimes we don’t even know it is happening. But when we allow ourselves to be vulnerable, we open ourselves up to the working on the Spirit between us.

As we move into the end of this Lenten season, I want to encourage all of us to consider the ways in which we can continue the table fellowship we begin in worship on a Sunday morning (communion and non-communion Sundays!). How can we take that and extend it throughout the week? Perhaps it is a cup of coffee with a friend before work one day; maybe it is having the

Perhaps it is a cup of coffee with a friend before work one day; maybe it is having the neighbors over for dinner some weeknight; could it even be a church potluck? Wherever (and whenever) it is, and whoever is there, let us live open to the working of the Spirit in our midst, that God's kingdom might make itself known in our breaking of bread and the fellowship we keep.

A Looooooooooooooooong-time member of Hamilton Union is celebrating a big milestone. Born on March 12, 1926, Jacqueline (“Jackie”) House is now 97. Jackie and her husband John (“Jack”) served for decades as officers of the church, they sang in the choir for 10 years, and they both were Sunday School teachers. She was a Deacon and served on the Social Witness Committee. Jackie also started the coop nursery school when their son was three years old.

Jackie and Jack were first introduced to HUPC when a man dressed in paint-splattered bib-front overalls came to their door just after they moved to a house near the church. That man was the Reverend Doug Gray. They quickly learned that his informal dress enabled him to always be ready to lend a helping hand. Once, when Jack was shingling the roof, Doug didn’t hesitate to get up on the roof to help.

The Houses had a great affinity for travel and were able to visit many exotic locations including Hong Kong, Australia, New Zealand and the Philippines. Evidently it was helpful that one of their four sons was an airline pilot.

As well as Jackie’s other interests, she was quite artistically gifted. She was known for her beautiful stained-glass creations. She also enjoyed making crafts with other church women for the annual “Lord’s Acre Auction”. You may notice that after the Christmas decorations have gone up in the sanctuary, there will be gorgeous carolers on the window sills. These carolers were hand-crafted by Jackie.

Jackie now resides at Our Lady of Mercy Life Center, in Guilderland. If you should happen to visit her there, be certain to take her chocolate. It is her very most favorite food!

If you missed this month's Session Review email, please let Kim know and she will gladly send you another copy!

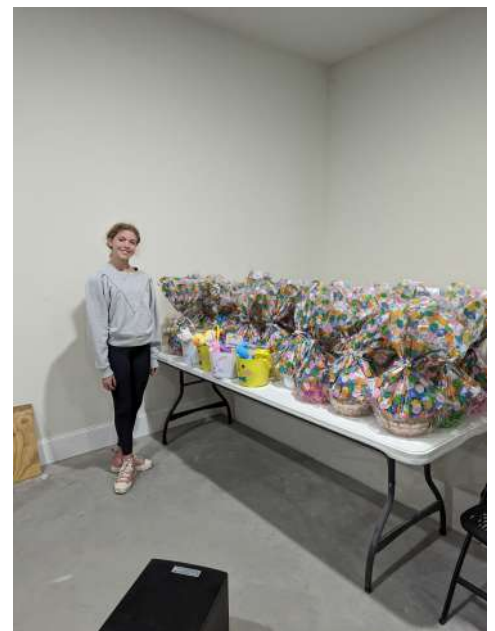
Dear HUPC Friends and Family:

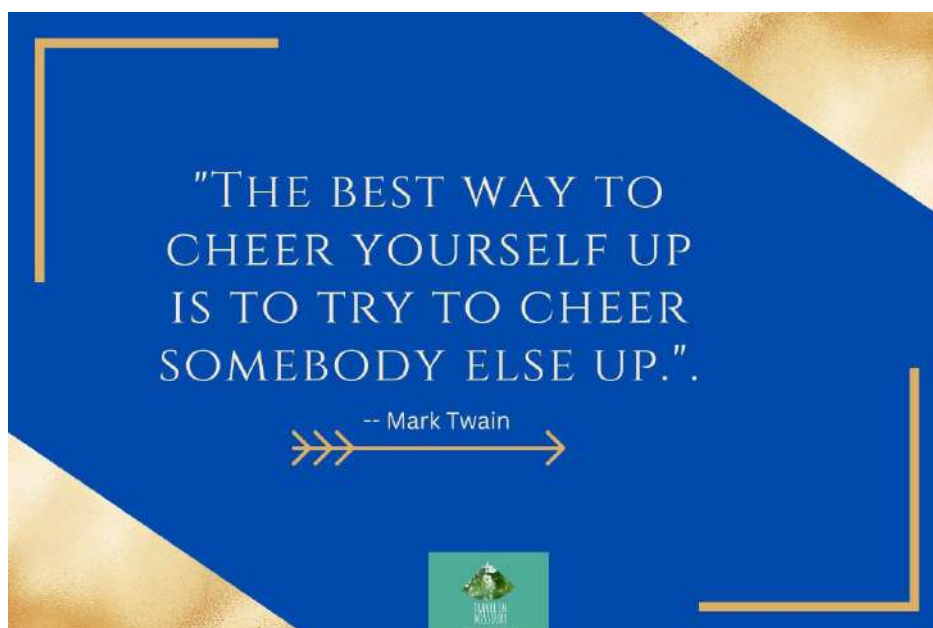

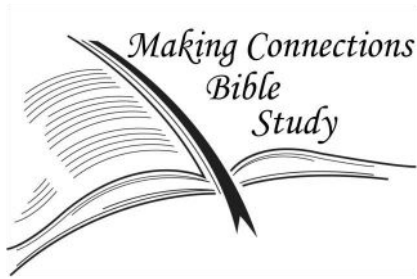

Thank you for the Moon Catcher's Project Donation

For many years Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery of Albany has supported the MoonCatcher Project. This organization makes reusable feminine hygiene products for girls and women in undeveloped countries, plus sets up guilds in these areas to provide local employment to empower the women there. In September, the MoonCatcher Project's sewing guild in Chituka, Malawi, was broken into. Equipment and supplies were stolen. As you know Chituka Village is where Keni Banda comes from, and it has been a long-time mission of Hamilton Union. This past December, Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery of Albany held a fundraising campaign to make donation to the MoonCatcher Project to replace what was taken. A total of \$3,465 was raised. Hamilton Union contributed generously. Our church donated \$500 from the Social Witness Non-Operating Fund and our Presbyterian Women's group donated \$675. I am so proud of Hamilton Union's dedication to mission.

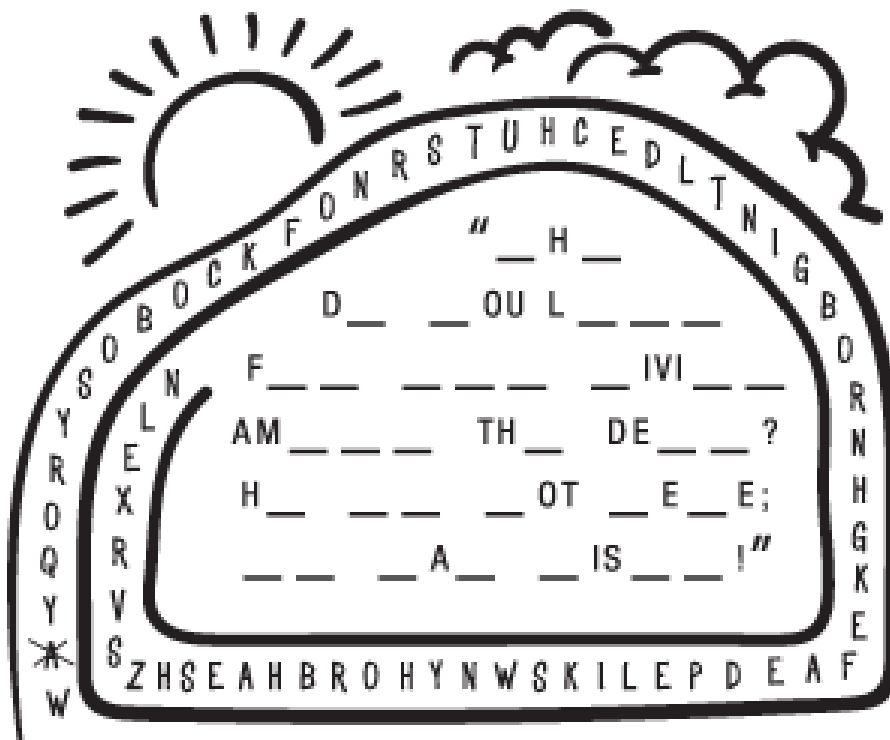
KIDS CORNER

Good news flags

Use batik, a unique fabric-dying method, to create flags celebrating the good news of Christ's resurrection.



What you need:

- Colored chalk
- White linen fabric
- Washable gel glue
- Acrylic craft paint
- Textile medium
- Paintbrushes

What you do:

1. Cut fabric to the desired size and shape. Set it on a flat, protected surface. With chalk, lightly sketch an Easter design or message.
2. Completely cover the chalk lines with gel glue. Let dry.
3. Mix equal parts paint and textile medium. Paint the flag with that mixture, which makes paint permanent. Let dry.
4. Soak the dried fabric in warm water a few minutes. Then gently peel away the glue to reveal the unpainted areas. Lay flat to dry.
5. Hang the flags and celebrate!
