

#### Friends in the Resurrected One,

It is no coincidence that Easter always comes in the beginning of spring. Even with its moveable date, it always lingers around that change in the seasons. By ecclesiastical rules set centuries ago, there are 35 dates on which Easter can take place. The earliest possible date for Easter is March 22 and the latest possible date is April 25.

Over the past few weeks, we have watched the grass grow vividly green, trees and flowers bud and blossom, and the weather turn out warmer days (the week after Easter was amazing!).

Yet I also remember that spring does not bloom all at once, in a fiery explosion of life and color (and most importantly, in pollen!). But rather, it emerges slowly, gently, awakening from the long slumber of winter to yawn and stretch and remember.

In the same way, Easter does not happen all at once. It could have - Jesus could have risen from the dead loudly and violently to make the whole of the earth tremble... but he didn't. He rose and appeared slowly to his closest friends and disciples. Individually, in pairs, and finally as a whole group. But when you read the resurrection accounts in any of the four gospels, you notice one overwhelming thing - the gentleness of it. Maybe because our human minds couldn't take such information all at once; perhaps it was that stretching and yawning awake from the sleep of the grave.

Above all else: remember this: like spring, Easter is a season. It doesn't happen just one day! It unfolds over the course of a few weeks - the weeks we are in right now. Let this awakening, the unfolding, this yawning and stretching time speak to you in new ways. Listen for the voice of our Lord, for he is calling us forth from sleep. 

Our Social Justice Book Club has just finished reading "Just Mercy" by Bryan Stevenson, the true story of how racial discrimination affects the American criminal justice system. Stevenson is a lawyer and the founder of Equal Justice Initiative, an organization committed to ending mass incarceration and excessive punishment in the United States, to challenging racial and economic injustice, and to protecting basic human rights for the most vulnerable people in American society.

Part of being able to move forward means we need to confront our past, even the ugly and shameful parts of our country's history like slavery and the racial terror lynching era. Lynching, in particular, has been shown to have contributed to the pervasive bias that people of color (and Black men in particular) are thought to be more dangerous than their white counterparts based solely on the color of their skin.

On Monday, June 19 (or Juneteenth, as it is celebrated in the African-American community), in partnership with Albany Presbytery and Hudson River Presbytery, we will be taking a Journey of Truth & Remembrance to Newburgh, NY, and Port Jervis, NY, to pay tribute to the men whose documented lynchings occurred at these sites in the 1800s with a special service. Carpooling will be encouraged to alleviate transportation stress. For Pentecost, make a thaumatrope, a spinning toy that creates an optical illusion of motion.

#### What you need:

- · White paper
- Cup
- Scissors
- · Pencil and markers
- Plastic drinking straw
- Glue

#### What you do:

- 1. Using the cup's circular shape, trace two identical circles on the paper. Carefully cut them out.
- 2. In pencil, draw a person's head on one circle. Then place the blank circle on top and use the image beneath to guide you in drawing a flame above the head.
- 3. Color the two images with markers.
- 4. Apply glue to the backs of the circles and sandwich the top of the straw between them so it looks like a lollipop. Let dry.
- 5. Roll the straw quickly between your hands to view a mini motion picture.
