


Family of faith,

We have arrived! On Sunday, May 19th, we will gather together to praise God and to worship in celebration of our bicentennial! 



Dreams Work

A minister was asked to speak at the anniversary of the founding of a local church.

Probably the most important statement the pastor made was this:

Here, yesterday, today and tomorrow meet For workers who dream And dreamers who work.

Think of the founding members of the church, the church of yesterday. They built the foundation. Concerning the church at Corinth, St. Paul said, "I planted" [this Corinthian church] (1 Corinthians 3:6, nrsv). Those who responded to the Gospel in Corinth were "the plants" so to speak, the first members of the congregation.

Paul went on to start other churches, but he did not leave those first Corinthian congregants to flounder alone. He left Apollos to water the new plants. "I planted," wrote Paul, "Apollos watered, but God gave the growth" (1 Corinthians 3:6, nrsv).

The church of yesterday began to include the church of today, and in time there would be the church of tomorrow. The seed of the great Gospel had been planted and the soil was good enough to bring forth more members.

The result was church workers. "Workers who dream" — workers who caught the vision and turned to work on behalf of God's kingdom. They were workers who tried to make the dream a reality. They were dreamers who work.

No church can survive without workers who dream great dreams. And no church can grow in good health without dreamers who work for the church of today and for the church of tomorrow.

Volunteer Opportunities

The Mission Team announces the next volunteer opportunities at the Regional Food Bank, to sort donated food:

All are welcome, first come, first served. NO sandals or open toe shoes! We are working in a warehouse. A good opportunity to serve the community, and the work is not difficult. So what about this big warehouse where we volunteer?

The Regional Food Bank of Northeastern New York owns and operates a 70,000 square-foot distribution center and office facility. The facility includes dry storage space, 17 loading/distribution docks, a 4,000 square-foot cooler and an 11,000 square-foot freezer. There are approximately 35 Food Bank employees operating the distribution center and driving the Food Bank vehicles.

- The distribution center receives 211,500 pounds of food a day
- The freezer is 321,000 cubic feet, which is equivalent to 53,000 household freezers
- The cooler is 120,000 cubic feet, which is equivalent to 10,000 household refrigerators
- Food Bank drivers travel approximately 421,000 miles a year (1,619 miles a day)
- The facility can store 3,086 dry pallets, 1,601 freezer pallets and 375 cooler pallets
- The Food Bank utilizes eight tractors, 14 trailers, 15 straight trucks, and five vans and serves 23 counties in Eastern New York.



a fun Flower Frog

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes




What you do:

- 1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
- Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
- 3. To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
- 4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- 5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase.
