

#### Women of the Old Testament

This summer, we will be stepping into the waters of the Old Testament to hear some stories of women who rarely come up in any lectionary readings (if ever!). We know very well the stories of Moses, Samuel, David, Samson, and Daniel (or we at least know of them!).

When asked to name women in the Bible, most worshipers name Eve and Mary, one the mother of humanity, the other the mother of our Lord. After them however, the list gets much harder... we know Ruth... some can name Lydia... but do you know the story of Deborah? Or Rahab? Or Jephthah's daughter?

There are amazing stories we tend to bypass in scripture that portray powerful, devoted women of God, and this summer we will be exploring their stories. The stories of the daughters of Zelophehad, or Achsah, or the Medium at Endor... the wives of David (he had a few!)... Gomer! I am excited to share in these stories with you, during our summer worship!

# "Music in the air: the life and music of Thomas Commuck" presented by Carol Scott, organist at Hamilton Union Presbyterian Church.

"Indian Melodies," a book of hymn tunes by Thomas Commuck, was the first published music by a native American, in 1845. Commuck was born a Narragansett Indian, and later joined the Brothertown movement. He became a prominent citizen of the Brothertown settlement in Wisconsin, and the first Methodist church in the Wisconsin Territory was built on his land there. We will learn about his life and sing several of his tunes.





So what about this big warehouse where we volunteer?

The Regional Food Bank of Northeastern New York owns and operates a 70,000 square-foot distribution center and office facility. The facility includes dry storage space, 17 loading/distribution docks, a 4,000 square-foot cooler and an 11,000 square-foot freezer. There are approximately 35 Food Bank employees operating the distribution center and driving the Food Bank vehicles.

- The distribution center receives 211,500 pounds of food a day
- The freezer is 321,000 cubic feet, which is equivalent to 53,000 household freezers
- The cooler is 120,000 cubic feet, which is equivalent to 10,000 household refrigerators
- Food Bank drivers travel approximately 421,000 miles a year (1,619 miles a day)
- The facility can store 3,086 dry pallets, 1,601 freezer pallets and 375 cooler pallets
- The Food Bank utilizes eight tractors, 14 trailers, 15 straight trucks, and five vans and serves 23 counties in Eastern New York.



Serve protein-packed waffles for a family breakfast on FATHER'S DAY or any special occasion.

#### What you need:

- Adult help
- Waffle maker
- Blender
- 1 cup old-fashioned oats
- 1 cup cottage cheese
- 6 eggs
- Cooking spray
- Diced strawberries
- Powdered sugar

#### What you do:

- With adult help, preheat the waffle maker.
- In the blender, add oats and cottage cheese. Crack eggs in a separate bowl, then add to the blender. Pulse to combine the mixture. Then blend on medium speed for 10 seconds.
- 3. Coat the waffle maker with cooking spray. Spoon about 1/3 cup batter onto the iron and close.
- 4. Carefully remove the waffle when it's golden brown. Repeat with remaining batter.
- Top with strawberries and powdered sugar. Makes about 6 waffles.
