

From Widows to Warriors: Women's Stories from the Old Testament

For too long, the women of the Bible have been depicted in one-dimensional terms. On one side are saints, such as Mary, while on the other are "bad girls," such as Eve and Jezebel. Just as often, the female characters of the Bible are simply ignored. However, the women of the Bible are complex, multidimensional individuals whose lives are inspiring, funny, and tragic in ways too many of us never hear.

Following our summer sermon series that explored some of these characters, we will broaden our view out to look at even more of these women who have often been overshadowed by their male counterparts.

In six sessions, we will look at the Matriarchs, the Women of the Exodus, Women of the Promised Land, Women of Israel and Judah, Women and the Prophets, and others.

We will meet at 7:00 pm via Zoom on Sunday evenings for six weeks starting on September 15. Books are \$13/each.




### What you need:
