

Dear Friends,

For nearly a year, the Holy Land has been enmeshed, yet again, in war. The people of Gaza and the people of Israel held hostage by their governments and leaders insatiable thirst for power and violence.

Since April of last year, a civil war has been raging in Sudan between rival factions of the military government, displacing thousands.

For nearly three years, Ukraine has been at war, fighting off a violent Russian invasion, the largest conflict in Europe since World War II.

Within our own country, political rhetoric and divisiveness have been ramping up in a hotly contested Presidential election.

It certainly feels as if the world is pulling itself apart at the seams, and it often feels as if the only way to find any semblance of peace is to turn off our connection to the world (our phones, computers, televisions, etc.) and simply ignore it all!

And there is absolutely nothing wrong with taking breaks. Our mental health needs times of peace in order to sustain the work we are about. But peace does not come about if we bury our heads in the sand

were it so easy! The work of peace (which the late Oscar Romero points out) is a product of justice, and justice requires work. But he also points out that there is another equally important ingredient: love.

And love is hardly passive. It is active. It is alive. It is on the move and stirs us to be God's partners in building the world that God dreams of. This isn't easy work. It isn't done overnight.

But it is work that, when we are engaged in it, can truly change the world. It may feel like we are hardly making a dent, but some of the best things come about slowly and with time.

During this particular season in our civic calendar, join me in praying for peace... for justice... for love... that all of these would reign supreme. Grace and peace, ~Pastor Kyle

Loving Your Neighbor in an Election Season A Special Four-Week Worship Series Tuesday Evenings at 7:00 pm October 15-November 5

There is no getting around it: we live in extraordinarily polarized and divisive times. And we are heading into what very well may be the most contested Presidential election in living memory. Anxiety, tension, and stress dominate headlines and threaten to overwhelm our personal physical health.

To help us work through this last month of an election cycle that feels as if it has been going on for years, we will have four special worship services on Tuesday evenings, beginning on October 15th. This means that our final service will be the evening of Election Day.

This series was written by Rev. Stephen M. Fearing, a PC(USA) pastor in Greensboro, North Carolina, and a Doctoral candidate at New Brunswick Theological Seminary.

Through our worship, we will take the opportunity to reflect deeply on our call to love our neighbors, especially in times of division.


